Title 49 U.S.C. 44703

(4) Requirement to Maintain Records.

The Administrator and air carriers shall maintain pilot records described in paragraphs (1)(A) and (1)(B) for a period of at least 5 years.

Advisory Circular AC No. 120-68D - Recommended

(3) PRIA-related records should be maintained for the duration of your employment with the air carrier or air operator an additional period of 5 years after the termination of that employment. Anyone possessing PRIA-related records must ensure that individuals not involved in the hiring process do not view or have access to your records. The one exception is the FAA inspector, who cannot be denied access to PRIA-related system of records when conducting surveillance or inspection.
